# New this year

With all the disruption of the last year, UWs across the state are working hard to make things as easy as possible for your students.

First, we would like to remind you that applications opened on August 1, 2020. The earlier your students apply, the sooner they can hear back and make plans for the year ahead.

Second, we are making the application process even easier this year:

- **No ACT/SAT:** UW System schools will NOT require an ACT or SAT score for the 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 academic years.
- **Lower Application Fee:** The non-refundable application fee for UW system campuses and universities has been reduced to \$25.
  - *Exception:* the application fee for UW-Madison remains at \$60.
  - Payments can be made online by credit or debit card, or by mailing a check to the admissions office of each campus where they are applying.
- **Redesigned Online Application:** The online application at apply.wisconsin.edu has been completely redesigned, with an improved experience to make the process simpler and more intuitive.
- **Needs-Based Fee Waivers:** All UW campuses and universities accept needs-based application fee waivers. Students who cannot afford the application fee can now claim an exemption by simply self-reporting their need on their application. Students will not be required to submit any other paperwork to support their exemption.
- **Transcript Uploads:** Students can now upload transcripts directly to the online application, saving time and money.

## A UW for everyone

With 13 four-year universities, and 13 two-year campuses, there’s a UW for everyone. Every UW has its own unique charms, student communities, and degree offerings.

UW campuses and universities have always looked at students holistically. This year the whole-student review is more important than ever since no UWs are requiring the ACT for admission. Here are some questions we regularly use to get students to think beyond their GPA and guide them to their right UWs.

Sure, your students will spend a lot of time on campus, but they should like the vibe of the city they’re living in, too.
- What online learning opportunities are available?**  
Most UWs offer online coursework. How much do your students want to take advantage of these resources?

What's the difference between UW's two- and four-year campuses?

## 2 THE TWO-YEAR CAMPUS

Earn an associate degree through a focused, two-year program.

Our two-year campuses offer the chance to live and learn closer to home, along with lower tuition rates, smaller class sizes, and more hands-on learning. They have simpler admissions standards and let students earn credits that they can transfer directly to other UW four-year universities.

OPEN ACCESS

All of the UW's two-year campuses are open access: they accept the majority of students who apply so every student has the opportunity to get the education they need.

## 4 THE FOUR-YEAR UNIVERSITY

Earn a bachelor's degree through a rigorous, comprehensive four-year program.

A degree from a four-year university positions students for an advanced professional career or graduate-level studies. UW's universities generally have higher standards for admission, and will look closely at the student's complete profile, including extracurriculars, volunteer and job activities, and life experience.

# Get Ready

What are the college preparatory requirements for the University of Wisconsin System? To start, all UW campuses require a minimum of 17 college preparatory credits from high school.

# Admission guidelines and college prep requirements

# Apply to UWs



Once your students choose a UW, it’s time to get all the pieces in place so they can apply as smoothly as possible.

### Application Steps

- Complete the University of Wisconsin System online application at: [apply.wisconsin.edu](https://apply.wisconsin.edu)  
  
The online application has been redesigned this year for a smoother, simpler experience.
  - One of the most important parts of the application this year is a really good essay. Encourage your students to take their time writing it—it can make a significant difference.
- Students must pay a \$25 non-refundable application fee (\$60 for UW-Madison) either online with a credit or debit card, or by mailing a check to each admissions office to which they’re applying.
- Submit the following documentation for each UW System campus a student applies to:
  - An official high school transcript. GED or HSED students should submit a copy of their diploma and test scores.
  - Official college transcripts (if a student took college credits in high school).
  - UW System schools will NOT require an ACT or SAT score for the 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 academic years.
  - UW-Madison requires a recommendation letter. However, students may submit letters to other campuses, too.
- After submission, the campus admissions office will let students know the application status and next steps.

**\*\* Do statistics and/or AP statistics count as a math unit for purposes of admission?**

**“No”**

They do not count towards the three units of required math (algebra, geometry, and advanced algebra).

**“Yes”**

As long as the other two completed credits are one unit of college algebra and one unit of geometry.

**ASSOCIATE DEGREE**

# Essay

Yes, the essay is important. But remind your students that each campus simply wants to find a reason to believe.

We encourage every student to think about the essay differently. UWs don’t use the essay to reject students. Rather, they look to the essay to find reasons to accept your students.

It’s a subtle, but meaningful, difference. Encourage them to write about their whole life experience: their successes, obstacles they’ve faced, and lessons learned. In short, the essay is your students’ best chance to convince their world why college is right for them.

### ALL CAMPUSES ASK THE FOLLOWING QUESTION

This part is all about you. Tell us about something you’ve done—academically or personally—and what you’ve learned from it. Was it a success or a challenge? Did it represent a turning point in your life? How did this particular moment in your life influence you, and how will it continue to influence you as you pursue your college education?

UW-La Crosse and UW-Madison ask one additional question:

#### UW-La Crosse

Please respond to the following: How will your life experiences, commitments, and/or characteristics enrich the University of Wisconsin–La Crosse campus community? Tell us why you are interested in attending UW-La Crosse and what aspects of the campus are especially important to you.

#### UW-Madison

Tell us why you would like to attend the University of Wisconsin–Madison. In addition, please include why you are interested in studying the major(s) you have selected. If you selected undecided, please describe your areas of possible academic interest.
