OLYMPIC-CALIBER TRACK UPGRADES

UWO resurfaced the outdoor track at Titan Stadium with an **Olympic-caliber Beynon surface**—similar to the track used for the U.S. Olympic Trials at the world-renowned Hayward Field in Oregon. The upgrade improves training and competition conditions for Titan student-athletes and allows UWO to once again host premier events like the Titan Invitational.


