## 2025 Universities of Wisconsin Fall Workshop Frequently Asked Questions

### **Universities of Wisconsin ACT/SAT Test-Optional:**

The Universities of Wisconsin is test-optional for students applying for undergraduate admission for Spring 2025 through Summer 2027 term. This applies to current high school students (Class of 2026) applying for the Fall 2026 term.

This includes admission to the following terms: Spring 2026, Summer 2026, Fall 2026, Spring 2027, and Summer 2027 terms. The last term that students will be able to opt out of submitting an ACT/SAT score will be for admission to Summer 2027 term unless the Universities of Wisconsin Board of Regents takes additional action regarding test score requirements before that time.

### **Are Direct Admit Wisconsin and The Wisconsin Guarantee the same program?**

No. These are two distinct programs that both offer pathways to first-year student/freshman admission at any UW university, but that operate differently and have unique eligibility criteria.

Ten of 13 Universities of Wisconsin are currently participating in Direct Admit Wisconsin. Direct Admit Wisconsin offers early and proactive admission to participating Universities of Wisconsin to high school seniors at participating Wisconsin high schools. The Universities of Wisconsin collaborate with participating high schools to review student academic records (high school courses and GPA) at the end of their junior year and make offers of admission to participating UW universities without the need to submit a traditional admission application.

The Wisconsin Guarantee offers guaranteed admission to all Universities of Wisconsin except UW-Madison to first-year applicants from Wisconsin high schools who are in the top 10% of their class at the end of 11th grade, or Wisconsin residents who are homeschooled and receive an ACT score in the national 90th percentile ranking or higher or are a National Merit Scholarship finalist. First-year applicants from Wisconsin high schools who are in the top 5% of their class at the end of 11th grade, or Wisconsin residents who are homeschooled and receive an ACT score in the national 98th percentile ranking or higher or are a National Merit Scholarship finalist will be guaranteed admission to the UW-Madison through The Wisconsin Guarantee.

### **Supports for students with IEPs and 504 plans**

Students do not have an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan in college. Additionally, accommodations and services do not "automatically transfer" from high school to college. Students seeking services at the college level should seek accommodations before the end of senior year. Students must identify as a student who needs services, apply for services, and submit appropriate documentation.

After a student has determined which UW they will be attending, they will need to self-identify with the Accessibility/Disability Services office. Students will want to make an appointment/meet with the Accessibility/Disability Services office at the UW for an intake appointment before the first semester begins. This appointment provides students with the opportunity to discuss documentation and accommodations, how to request and use accommodations, and get any questions answered. Students will receive accommodations through the accommodation plans they create with their Accessibility/Disability Services advisor.

Accessibility/Disability Services offices do not share student accommodation needs with instructors. Students are responsible for sharing their accommodations and may choose which instructors to inform, as accommodation needs can vary by course. Accommodations need to be submitted to/shared with instructors before the start of each semester. Accommodation needs may change over time, and students can revisit their previously approved accommodation plans.

**What is the essay prompt for the Universities of Wisconsin application for admission?**

The Universities of Wisconsin application for admission asks the following question of new first-year/freshman applicants: “Each student is unique. Please tell us about the particular life experiences, talents, commitments, and/or interests you will bring to our campus.”

The following UWs require a secondary essay:

UW-Eau Claire: Tell us why you are interested in attending UW-Eau Claire and what aspects of the campus (academics, activities, experiences, etc.) are especially important to you.

UW-La Crosse: Please respond to ONE of the following: (1) Tell us about any circumstances that may have had an impact on your academic performance. OR (2) Tell us why you are interested in attending UW-La Crosse and what aspects of the campus are especially important to you.

UW-Madison: Tell us why you would like to attend the University of Wisconsin–Madison. In addition, please include why you are interested in studying the major(s) you have selected. If you selected undecided, please describe your areas of possible academic interest.
