

JUNIOR YEAR TIMELINE

FALL

- Explore potential UW
 universities and see what
 appeals to you. Visit websites,
 attend college fairs and
 information sessions, and
 schedule campus visits to hone
 in on what's important to you.
- Complete the MyMajors
 (wisconsin.mymajors.com)
 assessment and consider
 possible career options and
 investigate the type of
 education that is needed.
- Review your high school class plan. Consider taking challenging classes such as AP/IB and/or dual enrollment.

WINTER

- Build a preliminary college list of schools that fit your personal, academic and financial needs.
- Start a resume of your activities, honors, work experience, and leadership.
- Explore summer opportunities on college campuses.

SPRING

- Research admissions requirements for the colleges you are interested in.
- Stay on track with your classes and grades.
- Ask the teachers who know you the best for letters of recommendation.

- Schedule summer college visits or virtual tours to colleges that interest you.
- Consider lining up a summer job or internship.

SUMMER

- ☐ Visit UW campuses (in-person or virtually).
- Finalize your college list.
- Starting August 1, create your Universities of Wisconsin Admission Pathway Portal (apply.wisconsin.edu). Prepare your application for admission! OR review your Direct Admit Wisconsin offers of admission and submit a Direct Admit Form!

- Take every opportunity to get to know your UW. Meet with college representatives who visit your school, attend local college fairs, and visit campuses.
- Continue to work on and/or finalize applications for college admission.
- Attend a financial aid event.
 Then, starting October 1, begin filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov.
- Keep track of application dates and deadlines, scholarships and housing.
- Search and apply for college scholarships.

WINTER

- Finalize and submit applications for college admission.
 - *UW-Madison has a November 1 Fall Early Action deadline
- Review your high school class plan to make sure you are on track to graduate.
- Check your email regularly for messages from colleges.

SPRING

- Submit Direct Admit Forms by May 1!
- Pay enrollment deposit
 (if required). Apply for housing
 and pay the housing deposit
 (if required).
- Review admission decisions and decide which UW you will attend next fall.
- Register for and take the Universities of Wisconsin Placement Test.
- Review financial aid offer from your future UW university.
- Make the last semester of high school count. Finish strong.
 These grades will be reviewed by the admissions office.

SUMMER

- Submit official final high school transcripts to the UW admissions office upon high school graduation.
- Attend student orientation at your future UW university.
- Get excited for your first year of college at a UW!
